Thanksgiving is one of my favorite holidays. I think of spending time with my family, eating delicious food and watching football. The Bible mentions giving thanks from cover to cover. Individuals offered up sacrifices out of gratitude in the book of Genesis. The Israelites sang a song of thanksgiving as they were delivered from Pharaoh's army after the crossing of the Red Sea. Later, the Mosaic Law set aside three times each year when the Israelites were to gather together. They were the Feast of the Passover, Feast of Pentecost, and Feast of Tabernacles.
